Our coach has help make sure that reading interventions are going well. The BTS music teacher provides teachers time to collaborate, analyze data, and plan for quality instruction. The plan included sending 7 teachers to the Solution Tree PLC Summit conference, but this conference was not held in Salt Lake this year. Additionally, Westland has exited the A2A program. We have continued to work to improve instruction, but without the A2A staff.
